The General Training Writing Module consists of two tasks, Task 1 and Task 2. Each task is as se ssed in dependently. The assessmen

Task 2 carries more weight in marking than Task 1.

Detailed performance descriptors have been de ye lo pe d which describe written perfo at the 9 IELTS bands. These descriptors apply to both the Academic and General Training Modules.

Task 1 scripts are as sessed on the following criteria:

- T ask Ach ie vem ent
- Coherence and Cohesion
- Le xic al Res ou rce
- Grammatical Range and Accuracy

Task 2 scripts are as sessed on the following criteria:

- Task Response
- Coherence and Cohesion
- L e xic a l R es ou rce
- Grammatical Range and Accuracy

Candidates should note that scripts will be penalised if they are a) under the minimum word length, b) partly or wholly plagiarised, c) not written as full, connected text (e.g. using bullet points in anypartofthe response, or note form has been a warded a band score and is is not appropriate, etc.).

### Task 1

### Task Achievement

This criterion assesses how appropriately, accurately and relevantly the response fulfils the requirements set out in the task, using the m inim um of 150 words.

Task 1 is also a writing task with a largely predictable output in that each task sets out the context and purpose of the letter and the functions the candidate should cover in order to achieve this purpose.

Co h er en ce a nd Co hes ion

This criterion is concerned with the overall clarity and fluency of the message: how the response organises and links information, ideas and language. Coh e ren ce refers to the linking of id e a s th rough lo g ic al sequencing. Cohe sion

refers to the varied and appropriate use of co he sive de vices (for example, logical connectors, pronouns and conjunctions) to as sist in m ak ing the co nceptual and referen tial relationships between and within sentences cle a r.

#### Lexical Resource

This criterion refers to the range of vocabulary the candidate has used and the accuracy and ap propriacy of that use in terms of the specific task.

Grammatical Range and Accuracy

This criterion refers to the range and accurate use of the candidate's grammatical resource as manifested in the candidate's writing at sentence le ve L.

### Task 2

### Task Response

Task 2 requires the candidates to formulate and develop a position in relation to a given prompt in the form of a question or statement. Ideas should be supported by evidence, and examples may be drawn from the candidates' own experience. Responses must be at least 250 word s in length.

Writing scripts are marked by trained and ce rtif ic ated IELT S exam ine rs . Sc ores m ay be reported as whole bands or halfbands.

On the next 6 pages you will find candidates' an swers to two sample Writing tests. There are two answers for each Writing task. Each answer accom pan ied by an e xam iner comm ent on the candidate's performance for that task.

## **Examiner comment**

### Band 5

The answer is below the word limit and there is some repetition of the task rubric. (Length is a common problem in General Training scripts.) Answers that are short lose marks because of inadequate content and may also lose marks because there is insufficient material in the answer for the examiner to give credit for accuracy and coherence. Despite these problems, the introduction to the letter is appropriate and the purpose of the writer is clear. The points are not always linked together well and punctuation is sometimes faulty. The sentences are kept quite simple and mistakes occur as soon as more complex structures are attempted.

### **Examiner comment**

Band 7

This answer is also short. Although ideas are often provided in the task rubric, candidates are at libert yto include some of their own ideas in their answers. In this case, the candidate has attempted to incorporate some original material. The answer reads quite fluently, is well organised and there is good use of conjunctions to link points. There are some grammatical errors but these do not affect the reader greatly and there is evidence of some more complex sentence structures.

There are some areas in the answer where the organisation becomes weak and the read er finds the message difficult to follow. Nevertheless, the writer's view is apparent and there is a logical flow to the points given. There are a lot of mistakes in the answer and some parts, such as the conclusion, are very hard to follow because of these errors. Although there is some appropriate vocabulary, sentence control is very weak. These problems are made worse by the poor correcting which sometimes makes words unreadable.
